Conference Overview and Objectives

The Inaugural International Conference on Distributed Event-Based Systems is following on the success of the previous five editions of the DEBS workshops held from 2002 to 2006 in companion with major conferences such as ICDCS, ICSE, and SIGMOD/PODS.

The objectives of the DEBS Conference are to provide a forum dedicated to the dissemination of original research, the discussion of practical insights, and the reporting on relevant experience relating to event-based computing that was previously scattered across several scientific and professional communities. The DEBS Conference aims at providing a forum for academia and industry to engage in this exciting discussion.

The conference aims at attracting approximately **150 attendees** among which a **large fraction** are expected to be graduate students.

The DEBS Conference in 2007, hosted by the Middleware Systems Research Group at the University of Toronto, will be held in Toronto, Canada on June 20th to 22nd.

The conference proceedings will be published as part of the **ACM International Proceedings**Series and will be disseminated through the **ACM Digital Library**.

The conference is organized in cooperation with USENIX, IEEE, IEEE and IEEE Computer Society, and ACM (SIGSOFT).

The scope and topics addressed by the conference include, but are not limited to: Models, architectures, and paradigms of event-based computing systems, middleware infrastructures for event-based computing systems, and applications, experiences, and requirements for such systems.

The DEBS Conference is the forum in 2007 to discuss trends on Event-driven Architectures, Service-oriented Architectures, and the integration of the former.

Conference highlights include:

- 1. Plenary keynotes featuring prominent and visionary speakers.
- 2. Scientific research, industry, and demo papers and presentations advancing and assessing the state of the art in event-based computing selected in a peer-reviewed fashion by an international program committee.
- 3. Invited lectures and tutorials given by world-class scientists and industrials featuring conceptual topics on event-based computing and industry success stories.
- 4. Social events to promote networking among the conference delegates in an informal setting.
